BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND, ARKANSAS:


Section 1: Purpose. The purpose of this Amendment is to bring into alignment the existing Article X, Signs, Billboards and Other Advertising Structures. This Amendment is to discourage the tendency to use signs which dominate the landscape and to provide guidelines for the erection, display and maintenance of signs, and to permit such signs that will not, by their size, location, construction, or manner of display, endanger the public safety of individuals, or to confuse, mislead or obstruct the vision necessary for public safety or otherwise endanger public health and safety.

Section 2: Penalties. Any person, firm or corporation found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be fined for each such violation as provided by law.

Section 3: Emergency Clause. This Ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, comfort, convenience, morals, safety, and welfare of the City of Highland, and an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the date of its adoption.
